Kyeema commemoration

Several History Group members attended the 70th Anniversary commemoration of the Kyeema aircraft crash on October 25th. Those who couldn't leave the Scarecrow festival to attend were able to watch the DC3s circling over Mt Dandenong.

All 18 people on board were killed when the Kyeema went down in 1938. The crash prompted the modernisation of air safety procedures in Australia.

History and heritage downplayed

The Yarra Ranges Heritage Network has written to the Shire protesting at the apparent lack of understanding of history revealed in the Arts, Culture & Heritage Plan.

The document seems to equate 'History' with 'Heritage', which in turn is treated as an aspect of 'Tourism'. The role of the Shire's many historical societies and other heritage-related groups as custodians of valuable collections and knowledge is not recognised. There is no provision for the support, training and mentoring of these groups by the Shire, as was previously the case.

The Museum redevelopment, while it has many positive aspects, will apparently not maintain the former close ties

with local history groups and will no longer house the Lilydale & District Historical Society. The Heritage Network has requested input into any further development of the Arts, Culture & Heritage Plan.

Museum update

The Yarra Ranges Regional Museum redevelopment went out to tender in October. Work is expected to start in February 2009. Maggie and the team have relocated to the Courthouse. The collections will be moved by the end of January 2009; children's collections will be on display until then.

The Museum is discounting a range of books, which will be discontinued from stock. Contact the Museum for details.
